

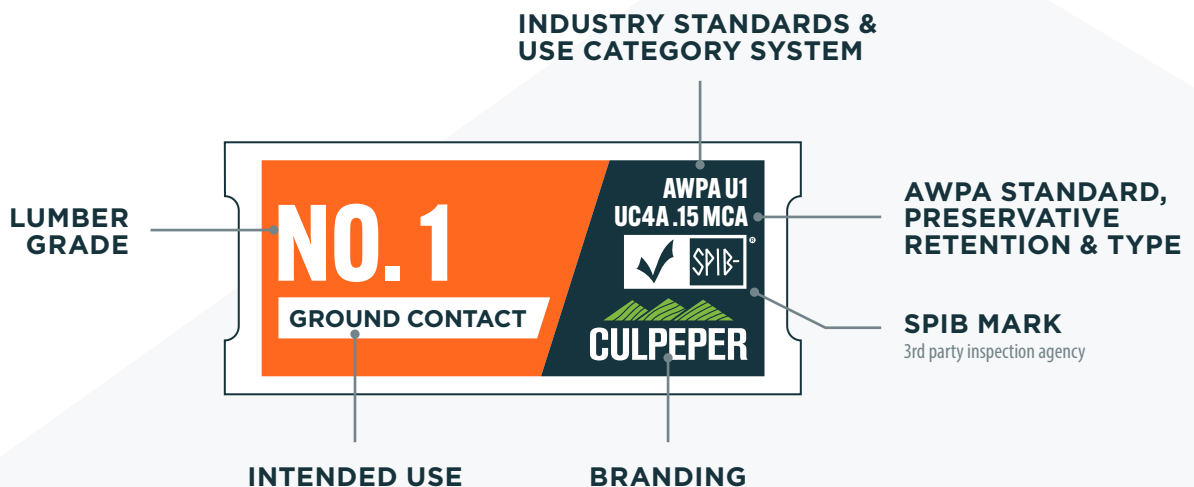

HOW TO READ AN END TAG

Culpeper pressure treated lumber end tags provide clear, helpful information about the product. With details on both the front and back, the tag gives you everything you need to know, right where you need it.

INTENDED USE STATEMENT

Above Ground, Ground Contact, Marine.

APPLICABLE INDUSTRY STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS

The AWPA Use Category System (AWPA Standard U1) designates what preservative systems and retentions have been determined to be effective in specified exposure conditions. There are five major Use Categories that clearly describe these exposure conditions: UC1, UC2, UC3, UC4, UC5. These categories are further broken down into sub-categories to define the degree of exposure hazards.

PRESERVATIVE TYPE

This is the type of chemical used in the pressure-treatment process.

PRESERVATIVE RETENTION

This is the minimum retention specified in the applicable industry standard for a batch charge of preserved wood. Preservative retention minimums are usually listed on end tags and stamped in pounds per cubic feet (PCF).

THE SPIB MARK

On treated-wood products the SPIB Mark has long been accepted in the marketplace as a symbol of quality. This mark has signified voluntary producer adherence to the bureau's standards of quality for over five decades, and is widely recognized and accepted by specifiers, users, and code enforcement personnel. Producers in good standing under our Third-Party Quality Audit Program may use the SPIB mark in association with the WWPI Checkmark for products treated according to AWPA Standards or the ICC-ES Global Logo for products treated according to ICC Evaluation Service Reports.

BACK OF TAG

On the reverse side of the tag you will find our product warranty statement as well as the plant location.

INTENDED USE AT A GLANCE

Culpeper utilizes a convenient color-coded system. White indicates Above Ground use, while Culpeper blue marks Ground Contact use.



IMPORTANT PROPER USE INFORMATION

This treated wood product is for ABOVE-GROUND CONTACT applications. Stable use DO NOT include in ground contact, within 1' of the ground and in or around fresh water. Above-ground exterior use including deck joists and beams that are difficult to maintain, repair or replace and are critical to the performance and safety of the structure, unless the weather and/or with your ventilation.
